Casselman River

- Grantsville area in Garrett County, Maryland
- Delayed Harvest stream: Catch and Release October 1 until June 15, artificial flies and lures only
- Beautiful Amish farmland and scenery
- About 4 miles of river from Grantsville downstream to Pennsylvania (flows north)
- Easy access (stream close to road)

Casselman River Wading

- Easy wading
- Under normal flows relatively many easy places to cross river
- Easy to get away from shore and overhanging brush and trees
- Big water so casting is easy (maybe average 30' across)
- Hard bottom
- Not real slippery (like the Savage River)



Casselman River Species and Tackle

Target Species

- Rainbow Trout
- Brown Trout
- Brook Trout

Key Equipment

- 8'-4wt fly rod for dry flies
- 9'-4wt fly rod for nymphing

Casselman River Flies & Technique

Dry Flies

- Light Cahill: #12 and 14
- Caddis: brown or tan: #14, 16, 18
- Adams: #12, 14, 16
- Green Drake: 6, same fly in white
- Griffith's knat
- Sulphurs—so they say

Nymphs:

- BH FlashbackHares ear #14-18
- Pheasant tail
- Copper john

Wooly Buggers:


Olive or Black #8-12 weighted

Key fishing techniques

- Fishing the evening hatch with dry flies is great
- Midday: subsurface wooly buggers and nymphs








