Conservation Corner - **Rich Baituk**

Conservation is one of the founding principles of the Federation of Fly Fishers. Contributing over 40 years of conservation work, the Federation of Fly Fishers is proud to continue protecting our fisheries and angling opportunities for the future.

The grassroots activities done by the work of our many Clubs and Councils are the heart of our conservation efforts. River trash pick-up, stream habitat restoration or letter drives to local government officials are all examples of conservation work.

The Fly Tyers Bench - De-barbing Hooks

The simplest and best solution to the problem of debarbing hooks is to avoid it altogether—that is, to use hooks manufactured without barbs. Such hooks have the strongest points, since the structural soundness of the wire is not compromised by the barb cut. Barbless hooks, however, are available in only a limited selection of styles and sizes and tend to be expensive—a fact that perplexes many tyers. In most hook making, the barb itself actually simplifies certain manufacturing operations, most notably forming the hook bend. Thus barbless hooks require alternate production techniques, which can make them more costly. Hence most tyers prefer to remove the barbs themselves.

Conservation...A Founding Principle

FFF Announcements

The Federation of Fly Fishers supports the rights of anglers to recreationally pursue fishing in the waters of the United States.

The U.S. Clean Water Act of 1972 establishes a policy of maintaining fishable waters. The Federation of Fly Fishers and its members wholeheartedly accept this provision and adopt the following pro-active policy in support of the Clean Water Act.

The Federation of Fly Fishers and its members shall...

- Support the Federal and State environmental agencies in their implementation and enforcement of water quality standards applicable to fish.
- Coordinate our volunteer activities and financial resources with other conservation and environmental organizations seeking to protect water quality;
- Participate in clean-up and restoration projects to build or improve fisheries;
- Encourage our members to monitor our favorite fishing streams and lakes by utilizing the appropriate tests from the FFF or other sources to measure temperatures, dissolved oxygen, turbidity, and other state and federal water quality measures to assure compliance with established standards;
- Report pollution events (oil and chemical spills, suspected polluting outfalls, violations of water quality standards, etc.) to emergency and enforcement officials.
- In appreciation of the quality resources gifted us by our forbearers; we shall leave these resources no less diminished to our children.
