2024 Bluegill Contest



Rules:

- 1. Open to all 2024 FSFF members. Entrant must be a FSFF member on date the fish was caught.
- 2. The first day to submit entries is Monday, 1 April, 2024. The last day to submit entries is Friday, 1 November 2024.
- 3. Fish must be caught on a fly via a flyrod. (No live or cut bait may be used.)
- 4. Fishing may take place in MD, DC, DE, PA, NY, VA, WV, NC, SC, FL, or the FSFF member's current home state.
- 4. Entries may be bluegills, hybrid bluegills or any member of the Lepomis Genus
- 5. This is a catch and release photo contest governed by the honor system.
- 6. All fish must be alive when photographed and released thereafter.
- 7. Entries are to be emailed throughout the contest period to Mark Bange, mbange54@gmail.com (Positions of entries will be listed on FSFF website throughout year.)
- 8. Tie breakers are determined by time of entry with preference to earlier entry.
- 9. Photos must be taken with the fish **on top** of any standard or flat measuring device that **clearly shows length of fish in inches from tail to mouth.** Photo should show fly if possible.
- 10. Longest fish in inches wins.
- 11. Entry email must contain following information: name of contestant, body of water where fish was caught, date fish was caught, name of fly used and recorded length of the bluegill.
- 12. Entries are limited to one fish per participant. Note that participants may present and substitute a larger fish during the contest as their entry. But they can have only one fish on the first place through fifth place leaderboard at a time.
- 13. Mark Bange will consult with club officers, if necessary, for ruling on close entries to determine length of entered fish. Clear photos are very helpful.
- 14. Winners will be recognized and awards presented at 2023 FSFF Holiday Party for the following places: First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth. Plus, the member who catches the smallest bluegill on a fly that is not in the top five will receive an award.
- 15. First Place winner will have his or her name inscribed on special clubhouse bluegill award plaque.
