
Stacking Deer Hair



Materials and Tools



Initial Stage – Preparing Hook





Hook Size: 2/0 Hint: using a heavier hook such as Ahrex TP6010 will not only resist bending, but will also help counterbalance fly in water.





Initial Stage – Preparing Hook





After coating hook shank in CA glue, spray Zip Kicker into a cut off bottle and hold over hook to allow fumes to activate glue.

This will create a glass like coating which will provide a solid foundation to build onto.

The bump of thread is required to stop the hair from sliding back too far on hook.



Stacking Hair – First Column









- Cut hair close to hide
- Remove underfur with fingers or comb
- Total sum of hair on top of hook should roughly equal the hair on bottom
- Wrap two to three times loosely, then pinch and pull thread

Stacking Hair First Column





- Keep tips on all bundles added to first column- they will become part of collar
- First stack added to bottom of hook for all columns (approximately 3 pencils thick)
- When wrapping thread, always follow the same path
- Keep tension thread at all times when winding


Use your scissors to create a space for the next bundle








Compressing both stacks Tying off

Stacking Hair – Second Column







Repeat stacking process following same pattern, beginning with hair to bottom of hook.







Stacking Hair – Second Column







Repeat stacking process to add highlight colors








Stacking Hair – Second Column



Pack hair and add glue. Ready to start third and final column now.

Advance thread Add final color stacks in same pattern Compress and tie off

Stacking Hair – Ready for Haircut




Stacking Hair – Ready for Haircut



Hint: Steam to soften hair for cutting

Stacking Hair – Trimming

Trim hair around eye of hook first Shape belly of fly with razor



Stacking Hair – Trimming

Shape body of fly with razor

Rough shape at first, then refine

Use sharp blade, replace as needed




Stacking Hair – Sealing the Fly
